
GOALS

BECOMING AN ALIRP PARTNER

You may be eligible to receive support from ALIRP if you meet the following conditions:

- You are a refugee or unaccompanied minor, or you are seeking asylum or another humanitarian immigrant status.
- You have a work permit, have applied for a work permit, or agree to apply for a work permit as soon as possible.
- You have never been ordered removed or deported from the US

SERVICES WE OFFER

Depending on your need, ALIRP may be able to provide the following services

- Financial support, for example, rent, utilities, groceries, assistance with legal fees.
- Support from Volunteers, such as grocery/food delivery, transportation, English practice, general support other than financial assistance
